A FOCUS ON WHOLENESS

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In 2023, we expanded our efforts to provide proven, promising, and innovative interventions to meet the full range of the needs of youth, launching a Wholeness Division.

We understand that children exist, thrive, rise, and love in relation to family, school, the larger community, institutions, and organizations serving them. We are committed to an integrated, intergenerational, culturally responsive approach to our work on behalf of the individuals and communities we serve.

Our Wholeness Division focused on preparing third and fifth graders for the transition to middle school and sixth and eighth graders for the transition to high school. With support from the Annie E. Casey Foundation, we are also focusing on five alternative high schools, providing intensive social and emotional learning support to students—including guidance to complete their educational plan and help return to their designated high schools. We are also looking forward to working with youth as they make the transition from incarceration to home, providing social and emotional life skills to support theirlearning and success in family, community, work, and life.



SOUTH BALTIMORE ADULT HIGH SCHOOL

A fresh start towards a brighter future

South Baltimore Adult High School (SBAHS) caters exclusively to adults over the age of 21, providing the opportunity to receive a high school diploma, post-secondary education credits or industry certifications. As adults, our students often face work or family responsibilities that make it difficult to complete their education. What sets SBAHS apart is the support we offer to ensure success, including flexible class scheduling, in-person or online classes, help with child care, transportation, housing and mental health. Elev8 staff work closely with students, encouraging them and helping them reach their goals.

ELEV8 BALTIMORE OVERSEES SBAHS, PARTNERING WITH BALTIMORE CITY COMMUNITY COLLEGE AND THE CHERRY HILL DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION. IN 2023, WE AWARDED SIX STUDENTS HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMAS, AND TWO RECEIVED POST-SECONDARY SCHOOL CREDITS. WE EXPECT THESE NUMBERS TO GROW SUBSTANTIALLY IN 2024.

"A PERFECT FIT"

Megan Muojeke knew she needed a high school diploma to follow her dream of going to college, but she kept hitting barriers. She was studying for the GED when she had her daughter but found the time commitments impossible to balance with her life as a new mother. "Before SBAHS, I was at the point where I really felt like giving up," Megan said. For Megan, SBAHS's low cost and flexibility were key to allowing her to go back to school.

"The program was a perfect fit for me. I was able to transfer my transcripts from high school so I could pick up where I left off. Taking online classes was perfect because I could stay home with my kids and didn't have to take the time to commute."

After graduating with her diploma from SBAHS, Megan is now studying at Montgomery College, working towards her associate's degree in general studies, with the hope of continuing her education to become a social worker.



ELEV8 BALTIMORE **FREEDOM SCHOOLS**

Elev8 Baltimore Freedom Schools is a unique high-energy, literacy-focused, six-week summer experience for students in grades K-12, that highlights local Baltimoreans and the Black, Brown and indigenous experience while reinforcing college and career readiness standards. Elev8 Baltimore developed the program curriculum, and texts were chosen to help kids learn about their worlds and about themselves, giving them the tools to challenge the status guo and advance positive change.

Through our volunteer reader program, students are exposed to a variety of community role models — from city council members to business leaders to Maryland's first lady - and get the chance to interact with engaged members of the community.

PATHWAYS TO SUCCESS

Too many disconnected youth in Baltimore are likely to experience negative outcomes

Often, youth become disconnected due to life factors beyond their control. Pathways to Success is a workforce development program designed to assist youth ages 16-21 with achieving their personal and professional goals through out-of-school time programming. Youth workers can earn up to \$1,875 while in the program. Our partners include Baltimore City Public Schools, Family League of Baltimore Baltimore Children & Youth Fund, Mayor's Office of Employment Development and the Maryland State Department of Education.

ELEV8 FOR JUSTICE FELLOWSHIP PROGRAM

We worked with 15 motivated young people in the 2023 cohort of the Elev8 for Justice Fellowship Program, providing training and support for them to become advocates and organizers. The young people who took part in the 10-week program engaged in training and created a project for themselves; each received a \$700 stipend.

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STRENGTHENING TIES TOWARDS A BETTER FUTURE

Maryland Corps Program

Elev8 Baltimore serves as a partner organization for Governor Wes Moore's landmark Maryland Corps Program, which offers a year of professional growth and career exploration to Marylanders so they can earn a living wage, gain new skills, and identify where their talents and purpose intersect while serving their community.

Corps Program members serve as Elev8 family advocates, earning \$17/an hour and a \$6,000 stipend at the end of their term. In the 2023–2024 school year, our five family advocates have enhanced access to essential community resources, including food, uniforms and housing. Their efforts have also improved family communication and connections with school staff, serving as liaisons, facilitating feedback and questions from families to school leaders, promoting shared decision-making and resulting in a stronger, more supportive school community.



AT COLLINGTON SQUARE ELEMENTARY/MIDDLE SCHOOL, THE FAMILY ADVOCATE INCREASED ENGAGEMENT THROUGH EVENTS LIKE CELEBRATEHER AND FOOD WITH FATHERS.

AT HARLEM PARK ELEMENTARY/MIDDLE SCHOOLS, THE FAMILY ADVOCATE, IN PARTNERSHIP WITH THE MARYLAND FOOD BANK, DISTRIBUTED APPROXIMATELY 80 BAGS OF FOOD FROM THE FOOD PANTRY WEEKLY TO FAMILIES AND STUDENTS, INCREASING STUDENT ENGAGEMENT AND DECREASING HUNGER-RELATED BEHAVIORAL ISSUES.

AT THE HISTORIC CHERRY HILL ELEMENTARY/MIDDLE SCHOOL, THE FAMILY ADVOCATE'S EFFORTS LED TO A REMARKABLE INCREASE IN PARTICIPATION IN THE ORGANIZED PARENT GROUP, GROWING FROM 4 TO 15 PARTICIPANTS. FAMILIES EXPRESSED THEIR SATISFACTION WITH HAVING A CONSISTENTLY ACCESSIBLE STAFF MEMBER FOR QUESTIONS AND FEEDBACK.

Overall, family advocates in their service year with Elev8 Baltimore successfully increased family connections to the school, enhanced access to vital resources, and boosted parent involvement, promoting shared decision-making and a stronger, more supportive school community, while building and strengthening their own professional skills.



BUILDING CAPACITY

Through a new partnership with Coppin State University, we're helping train the next generation of professionals steeped in the philosophy of liberation and equity. In 2023, we served as a field placement for two social work undergraduate interns, who provided valuable support in our schools.

Six licensed clinical social workers provide a variety of support services to our participants and their families. Our goal is to encourage more social workers to work in our communities and help them build the skills and empathy necessary to be successful. This objective meshes with our long-term goal of moving beyond just delivering services to becoming an organization that is actively building behavioral health capacity for the future.
